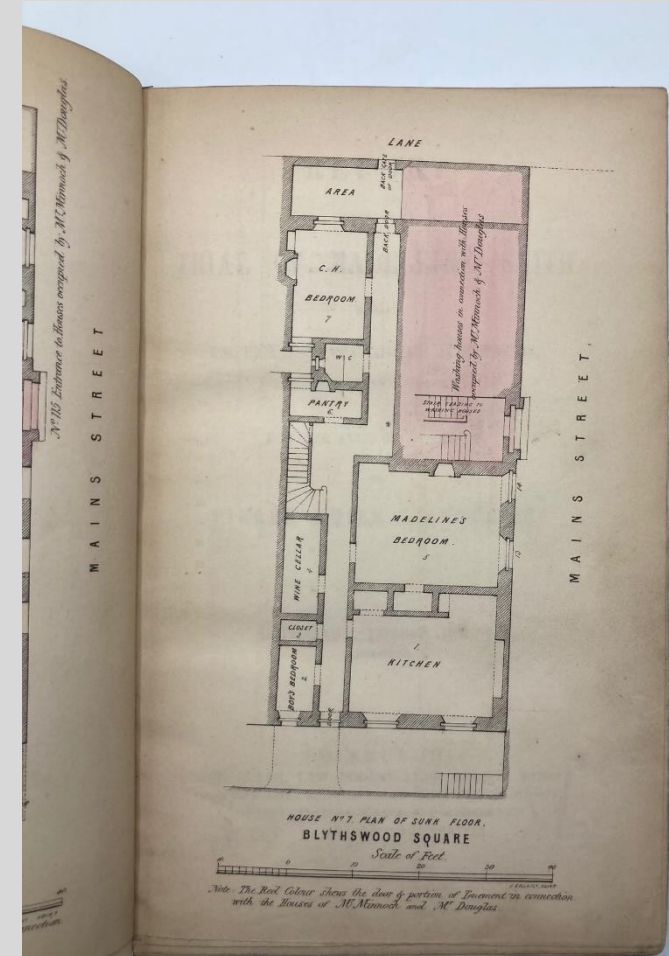
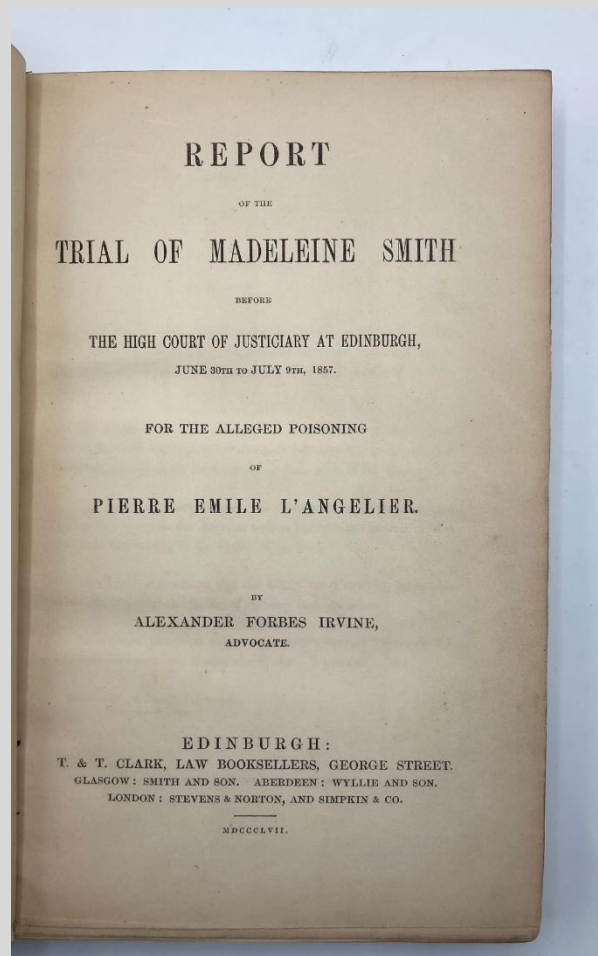
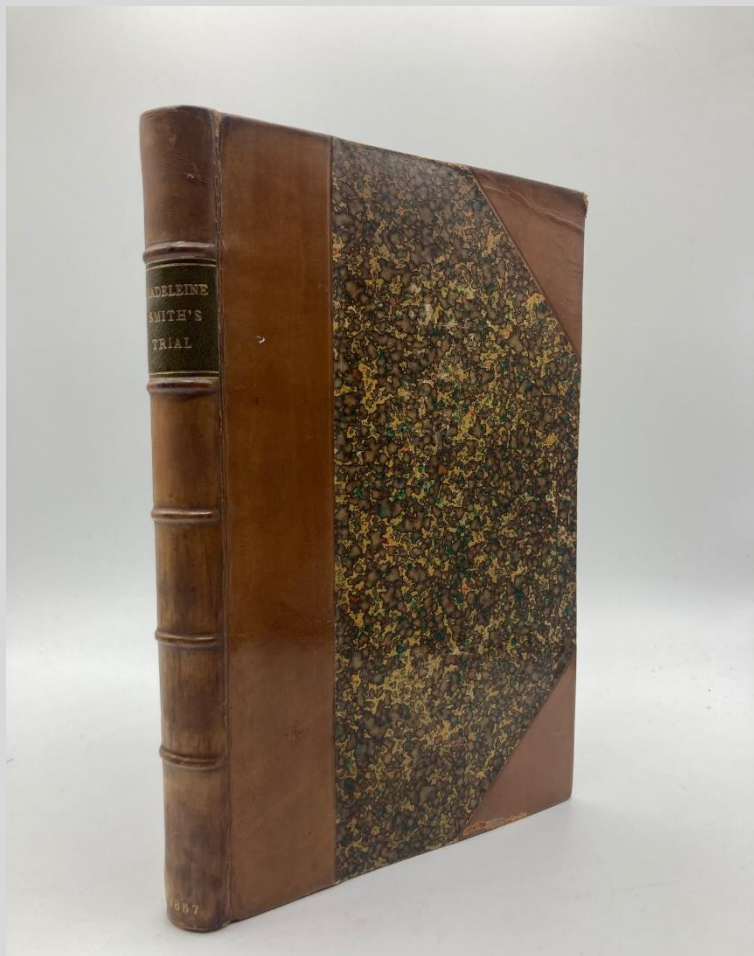
S. E. View of the Banks of CALDER and the Glen at Torrance

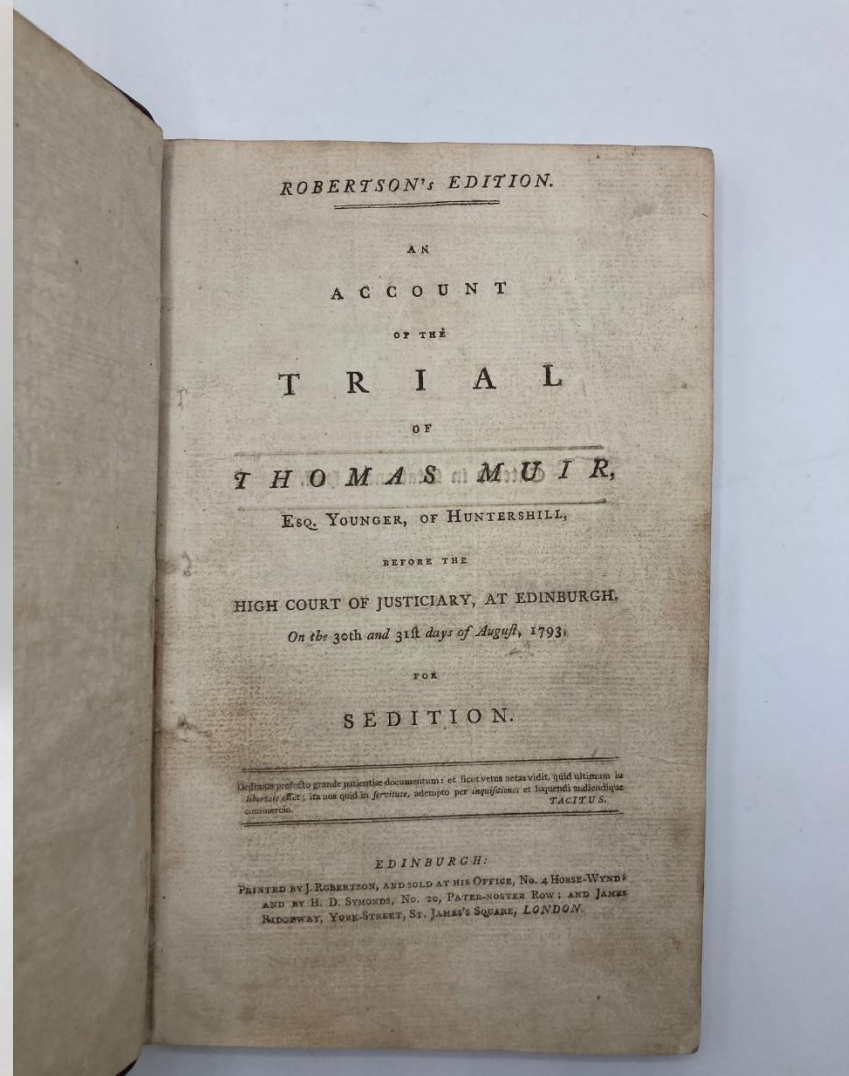
